

Dublin's Challenges

Growth

- Growing city: 6% population increase 2016-2022
- Housing pressure: Construction demands
- Growing economy: regional imbalance
- Growing waste volumes: since recession in 2008
- Stagnating recycling rates

Geography

- Global Supply Chain Reliance: Brexit & COVID19
- Dublin & Cork: Concentration of household waste
- Centralised Government: Prevents local adaptability





Dublin's Challenges

Impact of Waste

- 155k tonnes of household waste in 2022
 - 60.8% residual waste
 - 19% mixed recyclables
 - 20% food waste
- 588,233 tonnes of CO2-eq per annum
- CO2-eq impact of textiles is particularly high

Legacy Waste Considerations

- Unique market structure for waste collection
- Capacity & Infrastructural Planning
- Historic policy focus on waste, recycling & recovery.
- Historic local authority focus on litter control and waste



Domestic Material Consumption (tonnes per capita, 2022)




Generation of municipal waste (kg per capita, 2019-2020)



- Our recycling beyond municipal waste is far below European average



EU's Challenges

- Current high-level consumption and waste generation
- Interconnection of economic growth and waste generation
- EU Target to **double recycling** between 2020 & 2030
- Difficulty **measuring circularity** in a comparable way and in a way that truly measures circular progress
- **Driving reuse** and preparing for reuse through for example mandatory targets
- Ensuring **producer responsibility** schemes support and finance prevention of **reuse and repair**
- Supply chain realignment and requirements including critical raw materials
- Implementing circular product & Ecodesign Directives
